Sims Bark Plant Manager, Jamie Webster, addressed the court to answer any questions or concerns regarding the Sims Bark Mulch Manufacturing Facility located off of 431 South. Fiscal Court asked Webster to address the plans for minimizing smoke and fire hazards at the plant. Webster mentioned that they have purchased a second bulldozer to be used to maneuver the piles of mulch around regularly to minimize the chances of combustion and smoldering which will hopefully prevent smoke and fires at the facility. Neighbor of the facility, Sam Scales, presented that he has had regular issues regarding a constant noise nuisance from the facility but had noticed a positive difference since Sims Bark has built a noise barrier. Another neighbor, Becky McKinney, raised concerned about lighting at the facility and that she would like to see changes regarding the lighting at the facility especially at night as it is disruptive even inside her home. The Court asked Mr. Webster to return to court on May 12th with updates about Sims Bark of how they are handling these issues at the facility.

County Clerk, Stacy Watkins, announced the 2026 Primary Election plan including early in person voting from May 15, 2026 to May 16, 2026 from 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M. at the Logan County Extension Office and Election Day on May 19, 2026 from 6:00 A.M. to 6:00 P.M. at Auburn Elementary School, Adairville Elementary School, Lewisburg Elementary School, Logan County Career and Technical Center, and the
